A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

'Moroccan Plant Medicine Act'

BE IT ENACTED BY THE DALIL AZIZ HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. A decree to provide, regulation of Kif and Opium, inter alia, other sacred Ceremonial Plant Medicine, in conformity to the General Act of Algecaris 1906 (Articles 72, 73, 74)

- a. To permit Nationals, 16 years of age and older, to purchase and/or grow Kif, Opium, Sacred Ceremonial Plant Medicine, inter alia, for their personal use;
- b. To provide, for the disallowance of fees and taxes from the production, sale, or personal use of such Plant Medicine.
- c. To allow the assignment of price for sale, to be established by the National who owns and grows the Plant medicine.

SECTION 2. In this Act, the term 'Kif' is defined as: A plant substance, especially Cannabis, Ganja, Hemp, Hashish, Marijuana.

- a. AMPAG Nationals can enjoy the private use of their Ceremonial and Sacred Plant Medicine in accordance with their ancient customs and traditions, unmolested and without interruption.

SECTION 3. The Nabi, (Moorish Secretary of Education and Spiritual Science), will oversee determining the regulations and parameters for the proper exercise, consumption, production, and sale of Kif, Opium, Ceremonial Plant Medicines, inter alia.

- a. This privilege will commence immediately upon completion of all AMPAG State Nationalization requirements.
- b. Any county, city, town or municipal chartered colony not willing to adhere to these Moroccan Laws will be fined Twenty Thousand US Dollars (\$20,000.00) Federal Reserve Notes, by the State Provincial Government of AMPAG.

SECTION 4. This Legislation will take effect immediately after acceptance by the Dalil Aziz (Matriarchal Council) and the Wazir Al'Rais (Prime Minister) of AMPAG. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void notwithstanding.
